| Slips and trips | Change of floor levels. Liquids/cables on the floor | High | Being aware of differing floor levels Making staff aware of these trip hazards so that they can be dealt with by staff | Medium |
| Challenging behaviour from residents | Being on the receiving end of verbal or physical abuse | Medium | Ensuring pastoral visitors stay in earshot/sight of a staff member. The door of the room to be left ajar or open. Remove ourselves from the difficult situation immediately. Report the incident to a staff member at the home Report the incident to Cromer Church Clergy | Low |
| Fire | Being unaware of how to exit the building in the case of a fire or other emergency | High | Pastoral visitors need to *make themselves aware of where the emergency exits are on their first visit to the home * know where the gathering area is outside | Low |
